MANAMI, DALMIA - NABARD WATERSHED PROGRAMME:

- ➤ 3 Farm ponds created; additional water holding capacity 1350 m³
- ➤ 2 Trainings conducted for the farmers on the topics namely Organic Farming and Watershed Committee Roles and Responsibilities. 60 farmers participated.
- ➤ Exposure visit to Dharwad Krishi Mela with 16 farmers.

 They participated in discussion with progressive farmers in the areas of organic farming, agriculture mechanization and pest management.
- ➤ 7.75 lakhs of loan distributed to 20 women belonging to 2 SHGs at Hulakund.
- ➤ 2300 saplings of Mango, Sapota, Guva, lemon and curry leaves distributed to 575 farmers.

LIVELIHOOD:

- Facilitated 50 job cards under MNREGA at Tondikatti panchayat.
- Financially supported 60 farmers under Gram Parivartan for purchasing Milch animals in CSR core villages.
- 60 farmers supported to purchase goats.
 120 goats purchased till September.
- ➤ DBF spent Rs.1.2L; beneficiaries contributed Rs.10,000 each.

LIVELIHOOD OPTIONS THROUGH CREDIT LINKAGES

- Self Help Groups credit linked for 7.61 lakhs.
- ➤ 30 women received support from DBF in Yadwad and Girisagar villages.

GRAM PARIVARTAN

(An action towards bringing change)

Introduction

The Gram Parivartan Program was launched with the aim of providing livelihoods that are economically sustainable, ecologically responsible, and socially equitable. The objective is to foster sustainable economic progress within selected communities, where household chosen for participation is expected to achieve an additional annual income of Rs. 1,00,000. This can be achieved through individual or group interventions and can function independently or converged with government programs.

Innovation and Success. A case study

Most of the blocks surrounding Yadwad had a Solar powered flour mill running with considerable profit. Yadwad did not have one. This was a good opportunity for the DBF team to promote the idea of starting one home based Solar powered flour mill in Yadwad. When this idea was floated, Kasturi Miraji, a progressive woman came forward to take a calculated risk by investing Rs.5000. DBF team further supported her with govt. scheme linkages from central government. Thus she got about 60% of the cost subsidized and established the mill in her house. Through this initiative she earns an additional income of around Rs.3000 per month. She has announced a 25% discount for the members of her SHG to avail services in her mill. Her efforts were appreciated by other SHG members.
