## 02. SHG Association: Livelihood Development Fund

- Two SHG associations were established to support women in starting new enterprises, expanding existing businesses, and purchasing livestock.
- **95 women** were benefited from this initiative.
- Each group is expected to **earn an annual income of Rs.1,10,000.**

## 03. Sewing Machine Support

- On the occasion of Founder's Day, **210 sewing machines** were distributed to women beneficiaries from the core villages.
- Each woman is expected to **earn an annual income of Rs. 48,000/-.**

This can be achieved through individual or group interventions and can function independently or converged with government programs.

## Success Story

Rice Sale Business by SHG Association Members



In Naranda Village, two members of the **Sangharsh Mahila Gramsangh Naranda (SHG Association)** initiated a rice sale business with support from DBF. The project involved an investment of **Rs.16,000** from DBF, **Rs. 24,000** from the beneficiaries, and **Rs. 1,09,000** in credit while each member is expected to **earn an annual income of Rs.50,000**. The SHG members purchased **48 quintals** of raw rice directly from local farmers, ensuring fair pricing and promoting their produce. After processing and selling the rice, the initiative generated a **profit of Rs. 37,738**. This venture not only empowered the SHG members with a sustainable income source but also contributed to the local economy and supported farmers in the region.





## Social Infrastructure



### 01. Health Checkup Camp

- A general health camp was organized in collaboration with Tata Cancer Care Hospital Chandrapur, PHC Naranda, PHC Nanda Fata, and OHC DCBL-CCW.
- **298 beneficiaries** from Antargaon, Sangoda, and Pipari villages received free health check-ups.
