### LIVELIHOOD INITIATIVES



**Mushroom Production, Suniapada** 

#### **Mushroom Cultivation**

- Training on Mushroom Cultivation was provided to 55 women in 6 villages.
- Supported inputs: Mushroom Spawn and polyethylene.
- Women are earning an average income of Rs. 3,500 to Rs. 4,500 per cycle.

### **Vegetable Cultivation**

- Demonstration of Vegetable Seed Bed Preparation for 33 farmers.
- Inputs such as vegetable seeds, pesticides, and fertilizers were provided as part of the demonstration.
- Income enhanced by Rs. 18,000 per cycle per household

#### Kitchen Garden

- 60 women were trained to create a circular model kitchen garden.
- Vegetable seeds, water rose canes, vegetable crates, and fencing nets were provided to the beneficiaries.



### **Livestock Activity**

- Livestock Health camp conducted in 8 villages.
- 365 households were covered.
- 758 cows and 810 goats were vaccinated.
- Medicines were provided with the support of the Veterinary Department.

### Introduction

The Gram Parivartan Program was launched with the aim of providing livelihoods that are economically sustainable, ecologically responsible, and socially equitable. The objective is to foster sustainable economic progress within selected communities, where household chosen for participation is expected to achieve an additional annual income of Rs. 1,00,000. This can be achieved through individual or group interventions and can function independently or converged with government programs.

# A SUCCESS STORY FROM LIVELIHOOD INITIATIVE



Name : Nandini Jamunda

Village Name : Suniapada GP : Garudagaon

District : Cuttack

Intervention : Mushroom Cultivation

Income from this Intervention: 6400/-

Nandini, a member of Darubrahma SHG in a Munda Tribal family, earns an annual income of Rs. 60,000 primarily through paddy cultivation. Despite her interest in mushroom cultivation, lack of awareness and financial constraints initially hindered her from taking up this activity. The DBF intervened by addressing her financial issues and providing spawn, polyethylene covers, and formal training. With this support, Nandini established a 40-bed mushroom unit, yielding 800g per bed and generating an additional income of Rs. 6,400 in the first harvest. Now, she is preparing for the second round of mushroom beds, offering a promising outlook for sustained income.
