Sipramayi, who received training from DBF in garment making, purchased a sewing machine and trained newcomers in the craft. She later established a boutique called 'Maa Mahalaxmi Boutique' and created employment opportunities for five young women. Expanding her entrepreneurial endeavors, she also opened a grocery shop and a section within it named 'Ladies Corner,' offering cosmetics and women's essentials. Thanks to these ventures, Sipramayi now consistently earns more than Rs. 20,000 every month.

SOCIAL INFRASTRUCTURE:



- Mobile Medical Unit and Health Camps have served 6,747 patients across 56 villages.
- 8 critical patients, including those with cancer and TB, received support for further treatment.
- 4 patients received sponsored cataract surgery from Melvin Jones Lions Eye Hospital.



- Constructed a toilet block at Saraswati Sishu Vidya Mandir, Byree.
- 292 students gain access to clean and hygienic sanitation facility in the school.
- Financially supported 6 economically disadvantaged students for higher studies
