02. Backyard Poultry

- **5,300 chicks** were distributed to **212 households** to enhance their income through poultry farming.
- Each household is expected to earn **an annual income of Rs. 30,000.**



03. Fish Farming

- **180 households** were provided with **5 KG Fingerling Fish** each to support their livelihood through fish farming.
- Each household is expected to earn **an annual income of Rs.50,000.**



04. Demonstration of Bamboo Harvesting Technology

- **7 training** sessions and demonstrations were conducted with **280 participants.**
- This initiative provided hands-on experience in bamboo harvesting techniques and introduced technology-driven methods to enhance efficiency and productivity.



05. Duck Farming

- **5,000 ducklings** were distributed to **200 households**, aimed to enhance rural livelihoods through duck farming.
- Each household is expected to earn **an annual income of Rs. 30,000** through this program.

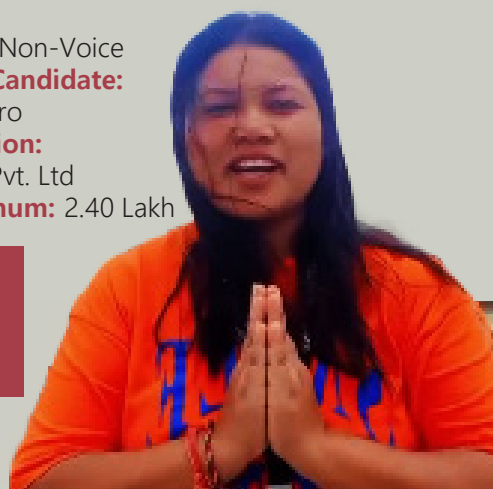
