- Each beneficiary is expected to **earn an annual income of Rs. 90,000.**

## 02. Training and Capacity Building to Sugarcane Farmers

- Farmers received training on advanced agricultural technologies and best practices to optimize sugarcane yield.
- **356 villages and 12,753 farmers** were engaged through mobilization van services.



## 03. Dairy Development through shorted AI

The BAIF initiative promotes artificial insemination (AI) to improve milch animal genetics, enhancing dairy production and increasing income for rural households through higher milk yield and better-quality dairy products.

- A total of **50 conventional AI procedures** were conducted **benefitting 37 households**.



## 04. Sewing Machine Support

- On the occasion of Founder's Day **50 sewing machines** were distributed to women beneficiaries, enabling them to start small businesses, generate income, and support their families financially.
- Each woman is expected to earn **an annual income of Rs. 60,000**.



## 05. Supported female goat to HHs

- Distributed **one female goats to 100 households** each with an aim to generate income by selling the goat's meat, or offspring (kids).
- Each beneficiary is expected to **earn an annual income of Rs. 30,000** through goat rearing practices.



## 06. New Micro enterprises

- As part of the micro-enterprise initiative, **two fast food shops** were launched, and one beneficiary was facilitated with **Rs. 10,000** to purchase four goats to start their individual enterprises.
- Each beneficiary is expected to **earn an annual income ranging between of Rs. 1,20,000 to Rs.1,69,000**.

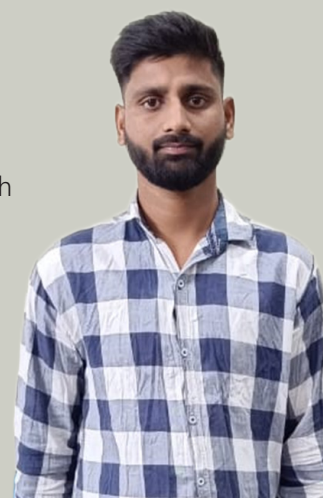
