## Livelihood Initiatives



### 01. Livestock Support

- To enhance rural livelihoods, sex-sorted artificial insemination (AI) was promoted to increase the birth rate of female calves, boosting milk production.
- **30 doses of AI** were administered, benefiting **30 households** and resulting in the birth of 10 female calves.
- Each household is expected to earn an **annual income of Rs. 72,000.**

## 02. Goatery An Effective Livelihood Intervention

- The “**Four Female Goat Model**” and “**One Pregnant Goat Model**” were introduced to boost rural incomes, benefiting **195 marginal households**.
- Over **500 goats** were dewormed, and mineral mixtures were provided to improve health and reduce mortality.
- Expected annual income per household is **Rs. 70,000 (over two years)** from the “Four Female Goat Model” and **Rs. 20,000** from the “One Pregnant Goat Model.”



## 03. Promotion of Kitchen Gardens

- The Kitchen Garden initiative provides affordable nutrition to low-income communities while enabling income through vegetable farming and sales.
- Vegetable seeds of **10 varieties** were distributed to **500 beneficiaries**, with training sessions conducted across three Gram Panchayats.
- Each household is expected to **earn an additional Rs. 15,000 annually** through this initiative.



## 04. Enhancing Livelihoods Through High-Yield Crop Cultivation Initiative

- High-quality seeds of potato, onion, and green peas were distributed to **1,547 farmers** in Samahuta, Baknoura, and Banjari Gram Panchayats.
- Training sessions were conducted to educate farmers on cultivating these crops, with each beneficiary expected to **earn an income of Rs. 35,000 annually**.

## 05. Mushroom Cultivation

- Training on mushroom cultivation was provided to **200 beneficiaries** to enhance household income through sustainable farming.
- Beneficiaries were supported with essential inputs like spawn, polythene, and fungicides, along with value addition techniques and marketing guidance.
- Each household is expected to **earn an income of Rs. 15,000 annually**.



## 06. Sewing Machine Support

- **175 sewing machines** were distributed to support tailoring businesses on sharing contribution basis
- Each beneficiary is expected to **earn an annual income of Rs. 40,000** through this initiative
