### Livelihood **Initiatives**



### 01. Duck Rearing

- **5,000 ducklings** were distributed to 482 households.
- Each household is expected to earn an annual income of Rs. 20,000 through this initiative.

### **02.** Backyard Poultry

- A total of **6,000 chicks** were distributed, with **each** beneficiary receiving **10 chicks**.
- Each household is expected to **earn an annual income of Rs. 15,000** through this initiative.



### **04.** Goatery Management

- **Five camps** were organized, during which 508 goats were vaccinated, dewormed, and provided with liver and iron supplements.
- 140 households were benefited.
- This initiative aims to improve the health and productivity of the livestock.



## **06.** Capacity Building of SHG Women

- 127 women from the Ramdhenu Village Level Federation (VLF), Akata VLF, and Baituntha VLF participated in three training sessions on fish farming, bamboo-based handicrafts, and backyard poultry.
- The training aimed to empower women with sustainable livelihood skills and promote ecofriendly practices.



### 03. Goat Breeding Unit

- **66 households** were provided with three goats each to support their livelihood.
- Each beneficiary is expected to earn an annual income of Rs.20,000.



## **05.** Training on Scientific Duck Rearing

- **299 participants** attended the Scientific Duck Rearing training, designed to equip them with modern techniques for efficient duck farming.
- The training covered key topics such as breed selection, feeding practices, housing, disease management, and sustainable methods to enhance productivity and profitability.



## **07.** Demonstration of Bamboo Harvesting Technology

- **Seven training sessions** and demonstrations on bamboo harvesting techniques were conducted.
- 175 participants attended these sessions to enhance their skills and knowledge in sustainable bamboo harvesting practices.
