01. Kitchen Garden

- **119 households** were introduced with high-yielding seeds and water-efficient practices.
- Each household is expected to **earning an annual income of Rs. 15,000.**

02. Poultry Farming under WADI Project

- **58 farmers** were supported with poultry farm shed, chicks, feeders, drinkers, and initial feed for ensuring sustainability in poultry farming.
- Each farmer is expected to **earn an annual income of Rs. 1,10,000.**



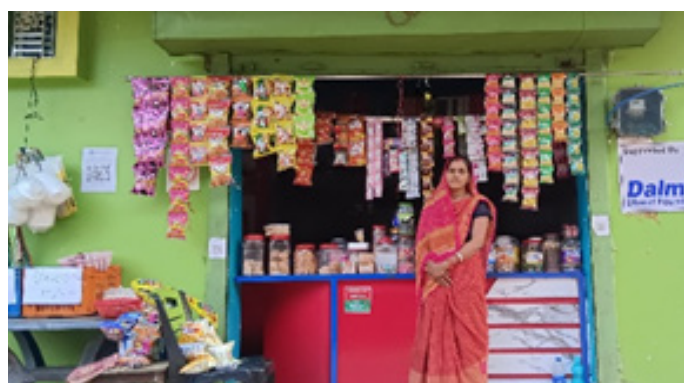
03. Livelihoods through Livestock and Fish Farming Initiatives

- **240 households** were supported for goat, pig and pisciculture each to improve rural household incomes by promoting sustainable livestock.
- Beneficiaries are expected to **earn an annual income ranging from Rs. 26,000-50,000.**



04. Sewing Machine Support

- Sewing machines were provided to **200 womens** to support their livelihood.
- Each woman is expected to **earn an annual income of Rs. 40,000.**



05. Micro-Enterprise Initiatives

- Supported **3 households** to the establishment of Grocery Shops, Bicycle Repairing Shops, and Tailoring Shops to promote entrepreneurship and self-reliance of households.
- Each household is expected to **earn an annual income of Rs. 1 lakh.**

06. Parwal Cultivation

- **80 households** were supported with parwal suckers, trellis wires, and PoP training.
- Each farmer is expected to **earn an expected annual income of Rs. 70,000.**

07. Spine Gourd Cultivation

- By providing spine gourd plants and specialized training, this initiative enabled **26 households** to generate over **Rs. 80,000 annually**, diversifying their agricultural income.



08. Mushroom Cultivation

- **46 households** were trained and equipped with mushroom spawn, resulted in **an annual profit of Rs. 50,000 per household** through mushroom cultivation.



09. Vegetable Cultivation

- This initiative aimed to boost income for **234 households** by providing training, technical knowledge, and high-yielding seeds for vegetable cultivation.
- Each household is expected to **earn an annual income of Rs. 60,000** from the sale of vegetables.

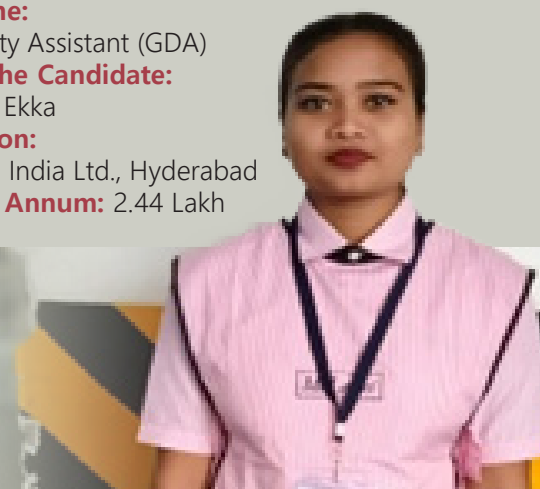

Social Infrastructure



01. Distribution of HSC Test Papers

- As part of educational support initiative, **496 HSC test papers** were distributed to Class-X students from 10 different High Schools in the Lanjiberna Mines area, based on selections made by the headmasters.
- This effort aims to improve students' academic preparedness for their board exams.



02. Swachhata Hi Seva (SHS) Campaign

- The Swachhata Hi Seva campaign is organized with the Gram Panchayats of Kunmuru and Alanda,
- **200 communities** from Alanda and Jampali villages participated in cleanliness drives, awareness programs, and Swachhata pledges.

- Training programs on nursery raising and vegetable cultivation, including spine gourd and Parwal techniques, were conducted with field-level support and hands-on guidance.
- **165 farmers** were benefited.
