# **01.** Sarayan Craft

- 64 Moonj craft artisans are engaged in creating Moonj products, generating a business worth Rs. 3.95 lakh.
- This initiative ensures financial security for rural artisans and motivates them to expand the Sarayan craft business.

# **02.** Sewing Machine Support **03.** Goat Based Livelihood

- **50 women** received sewing machines with the goal of promoting livelihood opportunities through tailoring.
- Each woman is expected to earn an annual income of Rs.24,000.



#### 04. New Micro Enterprise-Food Stall

- As part of the micro-entrepreneurship initiative, a rural food stall was established, offering fresh meals, creating self-employment opportunities
- The beneficiary is expected to earn an annual income of Rs. 1,44,000.

- 100 beneficiaries were supported to purchase a 180-day-old pregnant goat.
- Each beneficiary is expected to earn an annual income of Rs. 31,290.



#### 05. Press Mud for Soil Health

- Press mud was utilized to enhance organic matter, soil moisture, and overall soil health, offering significant environmental benefits.
- This practice helps reduce cultivation costs by up to Rs. 3,250 per acre and increases sugarcane yield by 50 quintals per acre, contributing to improved agricultural productivity.
- 875 farmers benefited from this initiative, with each farmer expected to earn an additional annual income of Rs. 19,650 per acre.

# **Success Story**

Pramod Kumar's Journey: A Success Story

As a result, Pramod's **monthly income increased to Rs. 12,000–Rs. 14,000**, bringing financial stability to his family. With the added income, he was able to invest in his children's education and improve their quality of life. Motivated by his success, Pramod now plans to diversify his product offerings and further grow his business.
